**ORDER PERMITTING JOHN DOE DISCOVERY BY PLAINTIFFS  
MICROSFOT, FS-ISAC, AND HEALTH-ISAC**

Microsoft Corporation (“Microsoft”), FS-ISAC, Inc. (“FS-ISAC”), and Health-ISAC, Inc. (“Health-ISAC”) (collectively “Plaintiffs”) *Motion for Leave to Conduct Doe Discovery* is hereby GRANTED. Plaintiffs are allowed immediately and without the need for further leave of this Court to propound the third-party discovery described below, including the subpoenas for the production of documents and information described below. Plaintiffs shall have four months from the date of this Order to conduct the discovery permitted by this Order. Should the need for additional John Doe discovery not encompassed below

become apparent to Plaintiffs, Plaintiffs may move this Court for further leave to conduct additional discovery.

**A. Domain Registrars**

Plaintiffs may serve subpoenas on each of the domain registrars that Plaintiffs have identified as being associated with the Defendants, as identified below:

Plaintiffs may serve subpoenas on each of the email service providers that Plaintiffs have identified as being associated with the Defendants, as identified below:

Without the need for further leave of this Court, Plaintiffs may also serve substantially similar subpoenas upon any email service provider Plaintiffs further identify as associated with the Zloader Domains.

**C. Downstream Third Parties: Internet Service Providers, Hosting Companies, and Payment Processors.**


Plaintiffs may serve subpoenas on each of the downstream third-parties that Plaintiffs have identified based on third party responses to the subpoenas Plaintiffs serve to the domain registrars and email service providers, including downstream third parties such as other email service providers, ISPs, hosting companies, and

payment processors. Plaintiffs also are permitted to subpoena sub-service providers, sub-sub-service providers, etc. identified by the respondents to Plaintiffs' ISP Subpoenas until the end-user Defendant is identified (*i.e.*, other providers in the service hierarchy between the top-tied providers identified above and the end-user Defendants whose identifies Plaintiffs seeks). Any third party that is the subject of Doe Discovery must be related to or associated with the ZLoader Domains.

Without the need for further leave of this Court, Plaintiffs may also serve substantially similar subpoenas upon other third parties associated with the ZLoader Domains.
